Eric was born in San Antonio in 1951, graduated from New Haven High School, near Fort Wayne in 1969, B.A.Arch. and B.A.Art, Rice Univ.,Houston,Tx.'73; M.Arch,Princeton Univ, '83. Awards: WW Watkin Fellowship in Arch.Resrch'73; H.A.Adams AIA Medal, Princeton '83; Carscape winner, Columbus,In'84; Progressive Arch. magazine citation for Courtyards project,'85.

Eric has been associated with Fort Wayne firms of Louis G.Petro Asscs., Cole Mattot Riley, and Grinsfelder Arch. Asscs. since 1967 to the present time.

Eric was associated with Michael Graves, Architect, Princeton, N.J., 81 to 82. In'73, he was with FW Housing Authority and City Plan Commission. In '74, he was Mayoral Appointee to Board of Directors of F W Public Transp'tn.Corp., and in 75 wa Dir. Dvlpmt. and Plng. of PTC.

From 76 thru 79 managed Black Creek Erosion Control Study as Governor's appointee to Allen Cty.Soil & Wtr.Consrvtn.Dstrt.,and in 1980 reviewed applications for historic renovation in Fort Wayne.

He is owner of Eric R. Kuhne and Associates, New York City, and serves as consultants for housing, public, commercial urban and river greenway designs. He also does developmental work in real estate management, design, financing, marketing. His recent design work includes Heartland, a 750 acre amusement resort; Carscape, an urban parking area; Aboite Estates, residential plan; Sheller Hotel restoration.

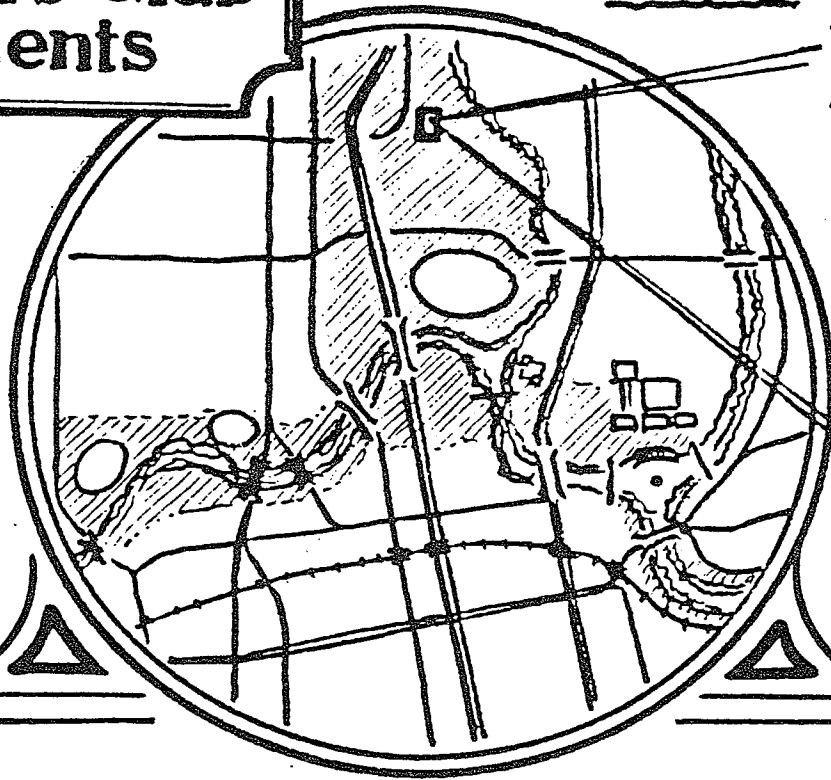
