MR. DALE WEAVER, MANAGER OF MANUFACTURING AT THIS NEW FACILITY IN THE SOUTH HALF OF GE TAYLOR ST. PLANT WILL DESCRIBE THE PRODUCT AND ITS MAIN APPLICATIONS USING SLIDES TO AUGMENT HIS TALK. HE WILL TELL OF THE EVOLUTION OF THE PRODUCTION PROCESS AND ITS NEED FOR A COMPLETELY NEW FACILITY FOR THE MODERN USAGE OF FLEXIBLE MANUFACTURING TECHNIQUES WHICH DICTATED THE RELOCATION FROM ITS FORMER BASE IN THE NORTH CINNCINNATI SUBURB. DRIGINALLY, A PLANT TOUR WAS PROPOSED, BUT DUE TO SECURITY AND 'CLEAN ROOM' NEEDS THIS IS NOT POSSIBLE.

MR. WEAVER HAS BEEN WITH GE FOR 22 YEARS, AND IS A '64 GRADUATE OF UNIV. OF ILL AND HAS AN MBA FROM XAVIER UNIVERSITY IN 1970.
